Topic: Virtual trip to Great Britain

Objectives:

Practical:

- to activate the students' educational activities through the use of multimedia technologies;

Developing:

Educational:

I. PRESENTATION OF THE TOPIC

T: Welcome to Great Britain! Today we are going to take a trip to one of the most beautiful countries of Europe. I want you to be positive, I want you to be in a high spirit today, I hope you'll get bright impressions about our lesson and discover a lot of interesting facts about Great Britain. You remember Mr Johnson, a big friend of Ukraine and a former Prime Minister, has visited Ukraine several times since the Russian invasion on 24 February. Besides, the UK is one of the leading donors of military and humanitarian aid to Ukraine and has imposed sanctions on Russian

T: Ladies and gentlemen, welcome on board British Airways Flight 178 to London. We ask that you please fasten your seatbelts at this time and secure all baggage underneath your seat or in the overhead compartments. T: Now, let's watch an old short video about Great Britain. It will help you to remind all information you've known about this country and get to know more. While watching, please, focus on:

- ✓ Parts of the UK
- ✓ Population of the UK
- ✓ Famous towns and cities
- ✓ Number of national parks
- ✓ Number of tourists, who visit this country every year

Post-watching tasks

T: So, let's look at the screen and check up your answers.

The British were really very proud of their Queen. Now, look. Here is a small exercise for you. There are some spaces that you are to fill in using the words in brackets. (*fifteen, dogs, Britain, one, seven, breakfast*)

T: OK. Let's imagine that we are in London now. Well, as you know London, is the capital of Great Britain. It's a very big city. London is situated on the river Thames.

About 9 ml people live in London. It is one of the most beautiful cities in the world. It is also a very old city. London is 2000 years old. They say "If a man is tired of London, he is tired of life." Our guides are already ready to tell you much more information about London. So, let me introduce you our guides. But to understand our guides better I suggest you to revise and repeat some words and word combinations after them.

Speaking

P1: Dear tourists! We start our excursion from **Trafalgar Square**. It's the most popular place for people to meet. In the middle of the square there is Nelson's Column, which is 51 m. high.

P2: Now we are coming to **Buckingham Palace**. It is the most famous place in London. It was the home of the Queen. There are 600 rooms in it. It has an indoor swimming pool and a cinema.

P1: In front of us you can see **the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben**. The Houses of Parliament is the seat of the British government. Big Ben is the huge bell in the clock of Saint Stephen's Tower. It may have been named after Sir Benjamin Hall. The clock strikes every hour and all people of this country take the time from it.

P2: Look! This is one of the greatest English churches, **St. Paul's Cathedral**. The Famous English architect Sir Christopher Wren built it in the 17th century after the Great Fire. It took Sir Christopher Wren 35 years. It is a beautiful building with many columns and towers. In one of its towers there is one of the largest bells in the world. St. Paul's Cathedral is not far from the Tower of London.

P1: **The Tower of London** is the most outstanding link in the chain of the history of the country. William the Conqueror ordered to build it. The Tower of London long continued to be both a fortress and a palace. It was also a prison. Nowadays the Tower is still a prison. Usually, a prison is a place where criminals are locked up. But in this prison the jewels are also locked up. The jewels are the famous "crown jewels" of England. Crown jewels are treasures that belong to king or queen.

P2: **Westminster Abbey** is also full of history. It was founded in 1050 as a monastery, but later it was rebuilt by Henry III. Nearly all the kings and queens of Britain were crowned and buried there. Newton, Darwin, Charles Dickens are buried in the Abbey. One of the treasures of the Abbey is the ancient Coronation Chair and the Stone of Scone upon which Scottish kings were crowned. Westminster Abbey is a symbol of English tradition.

P1: And this a museum. **Madame Tussauds** is a wax museum. It is famous all over the world. There are a lot of kings, queens, politicians and stars. You can see famous people from the past and famous people of today. It is very popular – two million people visit it every year. There are about 4 hundred figures in the museum.

P2: Fantastic! And here is the river Thames. London stands on both banks of the river. **The Thames** is the deepest and the most beautiful river in Britain. There are 27

bridges over the Thames and 8 tunnels under it. A modern but already very popular tourist attraction is the **London Eye**, a giant observation wheel located on the South Bank of the river Thames.

P1: And now we are crossing **Tower Bridge** over the river Thames. It is one of the oldest and most beautiful bridges in London. It is more than 100 years.

P2: Wow! Look. This is **St. Jame's Park**. It is one of the royal Parks. It is the oldest and the smallest of all royal parks. People like to have a rest in this park.

P1: And now you can see **the British Museum**. It has one of the largest libraries in the world. There are many old books and manuscripts there.

T: Thank you for an interesting excursion. You may take your seats.

T: We sometimes say that England is the country where you can have four seasons in one day. Every daily paper publishes a weather forecast. Both the radio and television give the weather forecast several times each day. British people say: "Other countries have a climate, in England we have weather." So it is natural for people to use the expression about a person "as changeable as the weather". In such a cold weather it is better to drink a cup of tea. In the afternoon, about four o'clock, the English have a cup of tea and a cake, or a slice or two of bread and butter. This time is called afternoon tea. High tea is at 5 o'clock. Speaking about Britain people usually stress on tea, but I want to show you a short video about what is better to drink with afternoon tea.
